OGF20 Wrap-up and Survey Results

Over 900 attendees from around the globe gathered in Manchester, UK May 7 – 11 for OGF20 and the EGEE 2nd User Forum. This event provided a unique opportunity for a large population of grid end-users and developers to interact with the standards-developing forum of the OGF. Steve Crumb, OGF VP of Operations, remarked, "Honestly, I was blown away by the great attendance and by the synergies resulting from bringing the EGEE and OGF communities together. This event clearly provided the content desired and the open forum where connections could be made." Tony Hey's keynote, "The Social Grid", emphasized the need for future Webbased grids that will leverage semantic technologies to enable the effortless composition of applications and services through social networking.

Other highlights from the week included:

- Over 60 charted research and working group sessions advancing work towards specifications
- Campus Grids and Service Oriented Knowledge Utilities (SOKUs) eScience workshops
- Enterprise sessions discussing the role of grids in key adopting communities like Financial Services, Pharma and Life Sciences, and Transportation sectors
- Grids Means Business industry program showcasing grid adoption benefits, hosted by the Grid Computing Now! Project.
- Exhibit area which showcased 25 technology solution providers and eScience projects in addition to the numerous EGEE project demonstrations.
- Six BoFs aiming to gain interest and awareness towards the formation of a chartered research or working group

OGF Grid Pavilion at Next Generation Data Center (NGDC)
