GridWorld 2007 and GridAsia 2007 Report Out From Mark Linesch

OGF is an organization that must align globally but also communicate and collaborate locally. Recently I returned from Asia where I participated in the GridWorld 2007 in Tokyo and the GridAsia 2007 Conference in Singapore. Both events are organized by OGF affiliates – Grid Consortium Japan and IDG Japan organize GridWorld and the newly established Grid Forum Singapore teams with the Singapore government to organize GridAsia. Both conferences were a great example of our international grid community coming together to share ideas and continue to progress grids throughout the world.

GridWorld 2007 was again well attended this year with thousands of participants attending the talks and interacting with the various grid solution providers on the exhibit floor. This year's event included a co-location with the Data Center Conference and Demo event and illustrated the continuing influence of grid and virtualization technologies on next generation data center environments. GridAsia 2007 was also well attended with representatives from Singapore and many other Asia countries. The newly established Singapore Grid Forum (SGF) was launched during the event. SGF is a great vehicle for collaboration between developers, organisations and government - focusing on issues and developments that are important to the Singapore and broader regional community.

Bringing everyone around the same table to share ideas, learn from each other, align efforts and promote adoption is critical from a local, regional and global level and I am very excited about the partnerships we have with both Grid Consortium Japan and the Singapore Grid Forum. Both organizations provide great leadership within their countries and the region and are very valued supporters of OGF and our mission.
